## FIRE HYDRANT FLUSHING AND WATERLINE MAINTENANCE

The Georgetown Water Department will begin flushing the entire water system on Monday, April 21, 2025 starting in Ward 1. Flushing of fire hydrants is an important preventative maintenance activity we undertake to maintain the integrity of the water system. Not only is this practice done for firefighting and public safety, this process helps us to continue to deliver the highest quality water possible to our customers.

The flushing process is done to remove minerals and sediment that naturally accumulate in water mains over the course of the year. Furthermore, this maintenance allows us to check and record water pressure to ensure the proper operation of the system. Finally, by operating each and every one of the 320+ fire hydrants in our water distribution system, we ensure each one is properly maintained and available for use in the event of a fire.

As a result of the line flushing process, residents in the immediate vicinity of the work may experience temporary discoloration of their water. This discoloration consists primarily of harmless silt and air and does not affect the safety of the water. If you experience discoloration in your water after crews have been flushing in your neighborhood, clear the pipes in your home by running all water faucets for a few minutes

### Qualifications for Candidates:

Pursuant to Charter of the Town of Georgetown, §3.2: The qualifications for Mayor and Town Council member at the time of their election shall be in accordance with 15 Del. C. § 7555(c)(1), (c)(2) and (c)(3) as amended<sup>1</sup> and shall also include:

1. The Town Councilperson from the First Ward shall be twenty-one (21) years of age, a citizen of the United States, the State of Delaware, a bona fide resident of the town of Georgetown, and a bona fide resident of the First Ward.
2. The Town Councilperson from the Second Ward shall be twenty-one (21) years of age, a citizen of the United States, the State of Delaware, a bona fide resident of the Town of Georgetown, and a bona fide resident of the Second Ward.

### Terms of Office:

Town Council terms of office shall be for a period of two (2) years.

### Voter Registration:

Register to vote before May 7, 2025 with the Sussex County Department of Elections:  
119 North Race Street, Georgetown DE 19947 (302) 856-5367.

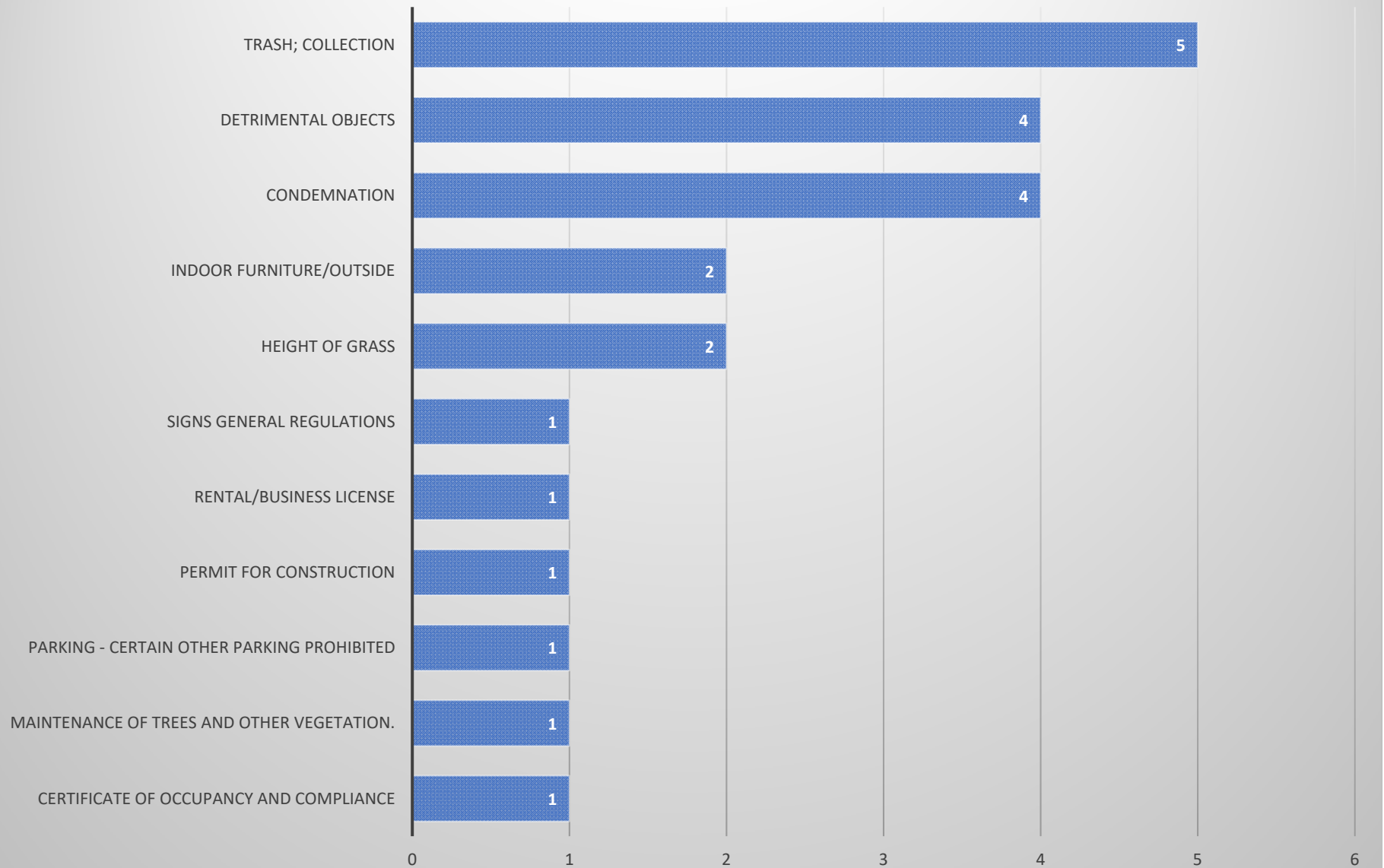
### Absentee Voting:

Any registered voter of the Town of Georgetown, who is unable to appear on the day of the election for a qualifying reason under Town Code, §39-1 and who wishes to vote by absentee voting, may do so by obtaining an "Affidavit for Absentee Voting" at the Town Administrative Offices. Absentee ballots will be available Monday, April 21, 2025. Following the submission of a qualifying affidavit, an absentee ballot can either be picked up by the voter personally at the Town Administrative Offices or mailed. **All absentee ballots must be received by Friday, May 9, 2025 at 4:00pm.**

<sup>1</sup> These State law qualifications require that a candidate for municipal office shall not have been convicted of a felony; shall have been a qualified elector of the municipality for at least one year prior to the date of election and shall be at least 21 years of age as of the election date.

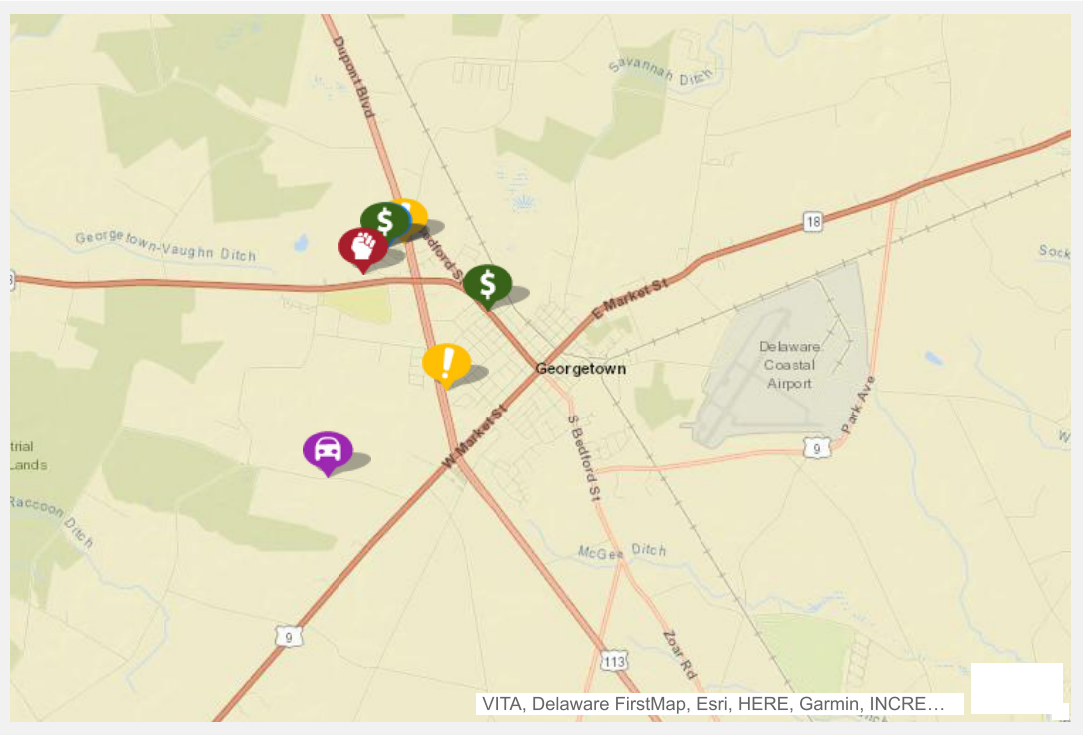

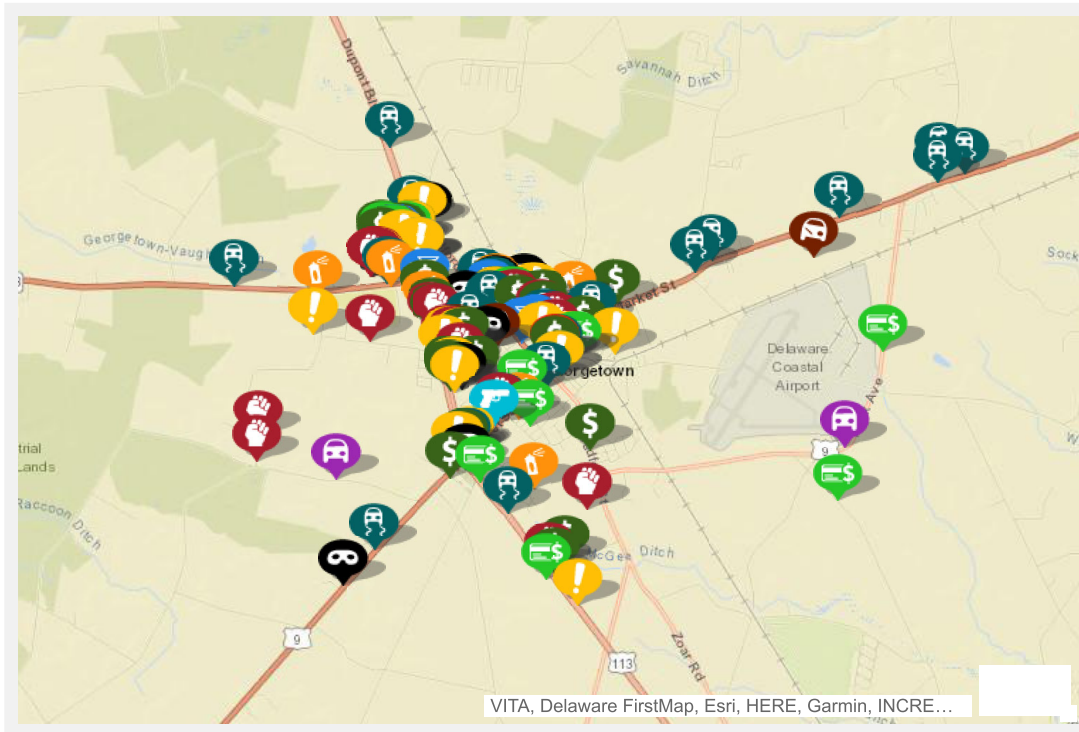

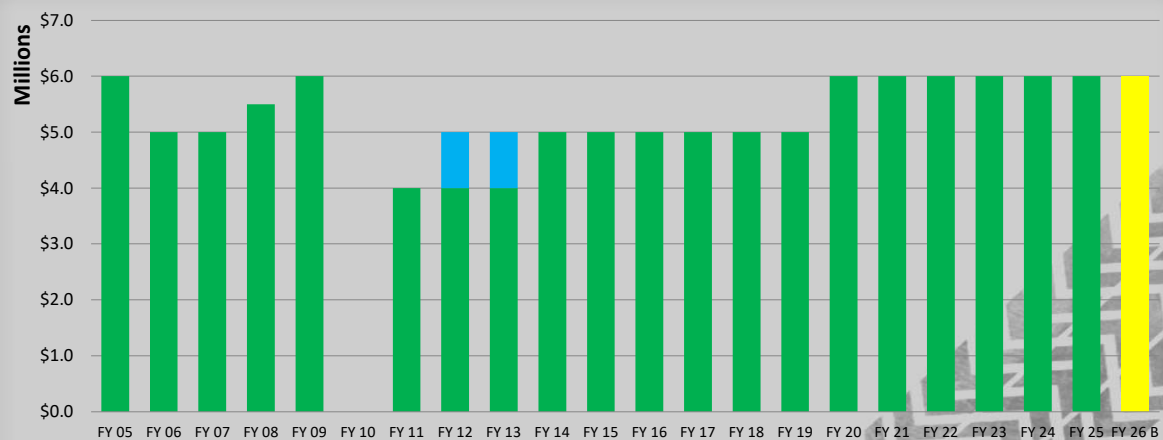
- Delaware Posted Asphalt Price (\$/English Ton)
  - Average for 2024 - \$579.31/Ton
  - Peaked in 2022 - \$798.33/Ton
  - March 2025 Rate - \$615.00/Ton
- Typical Street Rehabilitation
  - 1,000 feet x 24 feet x 4"
  - Equates to 600 Tons
  - 2025 Total Cost = \$369,000
  - *Plus:* labor, milling, and stripping

## HB48 – Accessible Parking Spaces

- Supports better regulation, definitions and enforcement of accessible parking in Delaware.
- Title II – Public Entities and Public Transportation
  - Designate responsible person (ADA Coordinator)
  - Conduct a self-evaluation – program access
  - Develop a Transition Plan
- Requires property owners to obtain a permit from the permitting agency for new or modified accessible parking spaces.
  - Permitting agency can be local county or municipal authority.
- Upon completion of the work, public agency shall verify compliance by conducting on-site inspection or independent compliance.
  - Use of documentation and photographic evidence.

## HB48 – Accessible Parking Spaces Cont.

### Possible impacts:

- Increased costs for local governments
  - Hiring of staff or consultants to assist with permit review and enforcement.
- Limited enforcement resources
  - Cities and towns with little code enforcement staff.
- Legal disputes or complaints
  - Business or property owners facing fines or compliance orders may contest.
- Possible conflict with standards
  - Different standards at each level of government can be difficult to understand and enforce.

## Market Data



As of 2023, Sussex County, Delaware, had a median household income of approximately \$78,061. This figure is slightly lower than the state's median household income of \$81,361 but comparable to the national median of \$77,719.



Regarding the housing market, in February 2025, Sussex County reported 354 home sales, consistent with the previous month and an increase from 330 sales in February 2024. The median sold price was \$434,500, a decrease from \$465,000 in January but an increase from \$421,250 the previous year. The inventory of homes for sale rose to 2,109, up from 1,888 in January and 1,692 in February 2024. However, the average time a home remained on the market extended to 70 days, compared to 62 days in January and 56 days a year earlier.

## New Construction not keeping up in Sussex

- Despite these figures, there remains a significant shortage of affordable housing in Sussex County. A 2023 report highlighted the need for more affordable housing options for both younger individuals beginning their careers and aging parents entering retirement. Additionally, a 2019 analysis projected that Sussex County would need to add approximately 1,549 net new housing units annually over the subsequent decade to meet housing demands, encompassing both market-rate and below-market-rate housing. The analysis also noted that new construction had not sufficiently addressed the needs of lower-income households, including essential workers in key sectors and individuals on fixed incomes.

## Delaware HB 442 Title: Delaware House Bill 442 - Key Points

- Introduced to support the development of affordable workforce housing. Signed into law by Governor Carney July 17, 2024.
- Provides incentives for developers to build housing accessible to middle-income earners.
- Aims to streamline zoning and regulatory processes to encourage construction.
- Seeks funding and grants to increase workforce housing availability.
- Created the Affordable Housing Production Task force.

## Affordable Housing Production Taskforce

### Role of the Affordable Housing Production Taskforce:

- The task force is charged with investigating and making recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on strategies for increasing the production of affordable rental units and homes in Delaware.
- Established to assess and address housing shortages in Delaware.
- Works with policymakers, industry leaders, and community organizations to develop solutions.
- Focuses on strategies such as expanding funding sources, revising zoning laws, and promoting public-private partnerships.
- Aims to ensure affordable, sustainable housing for Delaware's workforce.

## Task Force Timeline

- The Task Force held its inaugural meeting on August 29, 2024, during which members outlined their objectives and timeline. Subsequent meetings have taken place, including a session on October 7, 2024, where the Task Force explored affordable housing strategies implemented in other states. The Task Force has also formed subcommittees focusing on specific areas such as Regulatory & Permitting, Finance & Development, Construction, Manufactured Housing, and Community Focus Groups, each conducting regular meetings to address targeted issues. The full committee convened as recently as February 20, 2025, to review subcommittee recommendations. The Task Force is scheduled to submit its final report by April 7, 2025.

## Closing Notes

- Collaboration is key to addressing Delaware's workforce housing challenges. HB 442 and the Affordable Housing Production Taskforce play critical roles in expanding housing opportunities for working families.
- SCAT supports efforts at the state level to address these serious issues while respecting the importance of home rule and unique needs within the 26 municipalities in Sussex County.

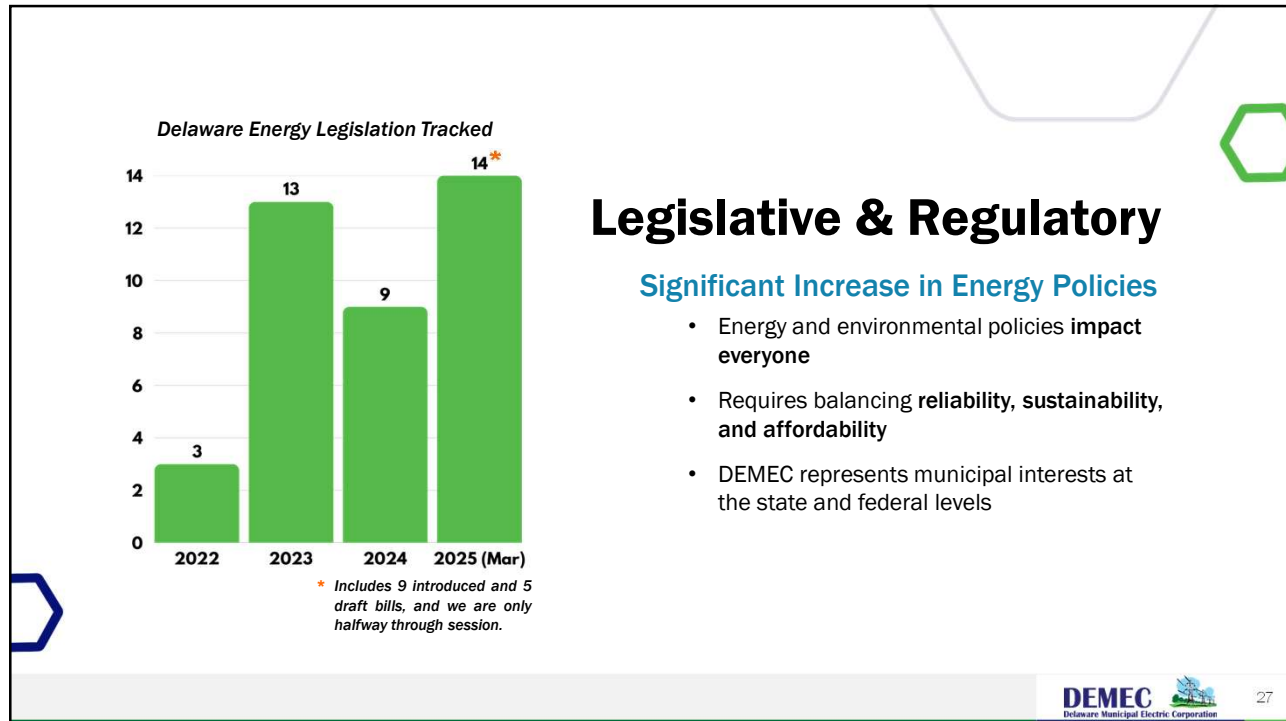
## Advocacy that benefits beyond DEMEC members

## Legislative & Regulatory (cont.)

### Current Legislation of Note

- **HS1 to HB62** – Electric/Heating Utility Disconnects (passed the House Committee 3/26)
  - removes requirement for utility to know which customers are receiving public benefits
  - sponsor of the bill plans to introduce an amendment to the bill adjusting details such as the location used for determining temperature to local airports in each county, who receives the shutoff notices, and how long electric and heating utilities have before implementing the requirements in the bill
- **Energy Generation Siting Commission** (*Legislation Considered*)
  - **Would override municipal and county local permitting decisions relating to energy generation siting**
  - Stems from denial/delay of permits for community solar and offshore wind

**Support of DEMEC's advocacy efforts from SCAT members would amplify the voice of Delaware's cities and towns.**

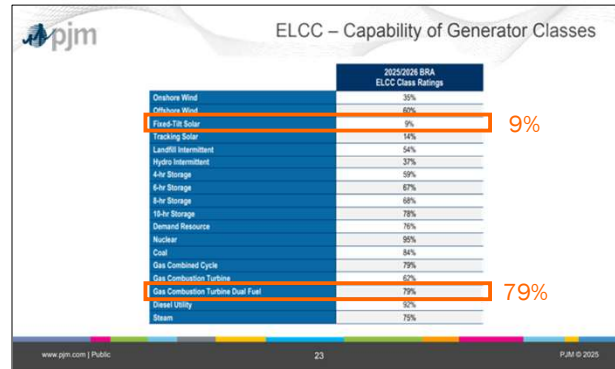

### Not all generation is created equal

- PJM's capacity value for natural gas is nearly 9x greater than solar and 20% greater than offshore wind
- Reliability monitoring agencies have noted that it would take 7MW of solar + storage to equal 1MW of dispatchable (on-demand) generation like natural gas
- Dispatchable generation provides attributes to the grid that renewables cannot:
  - Benefits**
    - Reliability
    - Flexibility
    - Grid Stability
  - Frequency Regulation**
    - Frequency Stability
    - Operating Reserves
    - Automatic Generation Control
  - Reactive Services**

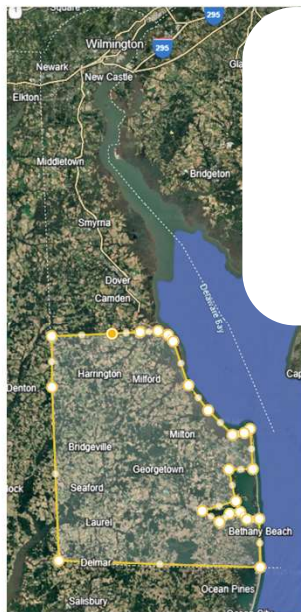

### 9-gigawatt (GW) Need

- State Leadership stated at the recent DLLG meeting that Delaware needs 9GW of energy
- Considering the capacity factor of solar and preference for renewable energy in state policy that would require 730,000 acres

**NOTE:** DEMEC's Beasley Power Station is a 100MW natural gas fired peaking plant that sits on 7 acres of land.
