6. STEP THREE GRIEVANCE HEARING(S) UNDER COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT – OFFICER COUCHMAN AND OFFICER DONAHUE – GRIEVANCE RE: TOWN FOIA RESPONSE (DELIBERATIONS IN EXECUTIVE SESSION FOLLOWING HEARING)

Town Solicitor stated Council has a package of documents from the Town and from the FOP.

Town Solicitor also provided a brief background of the grievance explaining that the grievance arose out of the Town's response to a citizen's FOIA request, and the specific documents that were provided in response to that FOIA. The only provision of the CBA alleged to have been violated was Article 2.02. The FOP also claimed that the Town violated FOIA (29 Del.C. Ch. 100).

Town Solicitor stated that the Chief of Police and Town Manager, found no violations of the contractual bargaining agreement at Step 1 or Step 2 in connection with the Town's response to a routine FOIA request, and denied the grievance, other than the Police Chief providing the remedy of removing the expired counseling.

Craig McGowan, FOP Representative, accused the Town of violating FOIA by holding the grievance hearing during an open meeting. McGowan said that the FOP had submitted its arguments in writing and would not be presenting evidence at the Step 3 hearing. No other evidence was submitted.

Motion by Councilwoman Townsend, seconded by Councilwoman Diaz-Malone to enter into Executive Session at 7:08pm.

A formal written decision from Town Council will be sent to FOP within 30 days according to the terms of the grievance procedure.
